



GYC RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRY TO THE CLUB AND BOAT STORAGE

- A valid GYC Membership card is required for free entry to the Club.
- All Guests and Visitors must pay an entrance fee of P10.00 per adult on Wednesday and Friday evenings and P20.00 on weekends. Guests are visitors who are accompanied by a member.
- Visitors may not make use of the swimming pool or the waterside and access to the water is restricted to boating members only.
- During Private Functions the Club house will be closed to both members and visitors. However, boating members will have access to the boating and launching area. A sign on the entrance boom will inform visitors when the Club is closed.
- Boats can only be stored at the Club if membership and storage fees have been paid. All boats stored at the Club must display an Water Affairs registration (MR) number.
- Dogs are not allowed on the premises.
- Only members and their guests are allowed to picnic and only at designated areas. **PLEASE DO NOT LITTER** – take your rubbish home with you or use the bins provided. **BOTTLES/GLASSES/DRINKS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE ROCKY AREAS IN FRONT OF THE CLUBHOUSE**
- Only members and their guests are allowed to camp on the island and only at designated areas and upon consent by a GYC committee member.

HEALTH AND SAFETY RULES

- Members, their guests and visitors enter the GYC premises at their own risk.
- The GYC does not take responsibility for any injury or damage to property which may occur on the premises.
- Children are to be supervised by their parents/guardians at all times.
- Life jackets are compulsory during regattas, and it is recommended that they are always worn when on the water. Children under 12 must wear lifejackets all the time when near water.
- The water is not safe for drinking.

RULES CONCERNING USE OF THE DAM

- Through the GYC agreement with the Water Utilities Corporation, Club members have the right to access and right to use the waters for the purpose of recreational boating activities. No power boats may be used other than official club rescue boats.
- No activities that may pollute or lead to pollution of the waters of the Dam is allowed. Any pollution incident must be reported straight away to a committee member.
- No vessel should be launched on the Dam unless it complies with Aquatic Weed Control Regulations as laid down by the Ministry of Agriculture.
- No boat is to approach within 200 metres of the dam wall.
- Swimming in the dam is prohibited
- No member or guest shall enter the dam in the knowledge that he/she may be a carrier of any notifiable water-borne disease.
